

# Hansueli Ryser

Hansueli Ryser is a native of Switzerland who holds dual citizenship in Switzerland and the United States of America. He received his Electronic Engineering degree in 1973 from the Federal Technical College in Zurich, Switzerland.

His engineering career began in research and development of specialized audio and video systems with Seeholzer AG in Zurich (1973-1977).

In 1978, Mr. Ryser became affiliated with CMI Inc., owned by Mr. Jack Fritzlen and located in Minturn, CO, the manufacturer of the Intoxilyzer® breath testing equipment.

- 1978 Project Engineer. Developed circuitry for the different evidential breath testers and traffic radar. Engineered various specific test equipment to verify performance and accuracy thereof.
- 1979 QC/QA Manager and Supervisor of CMI's technical staff. Established and staffed a QC department. Trained all technical staff in the applied technology, circuitry, calibration and diagnostics. Supervised the QC Department and the Service Department.
- 1980 Director of Manufacturing. Overall manufacturing responsibilities of the departments Production, Material Requirement Planning, Service, Inventory/Shipping, QC/QA, MIS and Document Control.
- February 1982 President. Under new ownership of Federal Signal Corporation, Mr. Ryser became President of CMI, Inc. with overall responsibility for the company.

In October 1986, Mr. Ryser accepted the Director and CEO position with EyeMetrics Corporation of Switzerland, a high tech firm which specializes in optics and optoelectronic image analysis.

- The first assignment (10/1986) brought Mr. Ryser to Chatsworth, California where he had to establish a manufacturing plant for the manufacturing of the "EyeMeter", a highly sophisticated device that measures the eye's topography in relation to the nose root and ear temples. A device used by Ophthalmologists to generate custom eye-sight corrections.
- November, 1989, Mr. Ryser took charge of the corporation's holding company (headquartered) in Switzerland. Aside from supervising the staff, Mr. Ryser established a "Master-Franchising" marketing concept for worldwide market coverage.
- In 1990, Mr. Ryser established manufacturing, engineering and marketing plants in Tokyo, Japan and Stuttgart, Germany.

Mr. Ryser joined Draeger in early 1991 as the President of Draeger-Switzerland.

- This position carried overall responsibilities of the Swiss subsidiary, including the marketing of the Alcotest® products, Draeger's breath test equipment.
- In 1994, Mr. Ryser accepted Draeger's offer to establish a new subsidiary in the U.S.A. which was chartered to focus solely on breath alcohol analysis applications. This became the Breathalyzer Division of Draeger Safety, Inc.

- In 2004, the Breathalyzer Division merged with Draeger Interlock, Inc. to form Draeger Safety Diagnostics, Inc. He currently holds the position of VP of Governmental Affairs. Draeger Safety Diagnostics, Inc. continues to focus on alcohol and drug testing markets.

Mr. Ryser became certified, 5-17-1996, for "Supervision and Expert Testimony" by the Center For Studies of Law in Action at the Indiana University.
