Greg is 33 years old and has autism. He isn't always able to communicate clearly. He could not explain to his employer that he was not vacuuming well because he could not see the dust on the floor, or explain to his parents that he was losing his vision. With a lot of effort his family finally realized they needed to take Greg to an optometrist who referred him to a specialist. The specialist explained that Greg had keratoconus and needed two corneal transplants. Thanks to two special people Greg can now see again. He can spot the birds in the trees, he is able to work again, read, and he can participate in his favorite sport, bowling. He even was able to participate in the annual Special Olympics. Says his mother, “His doctors and the donors have helped him to be able to see again, and he's pretty happy about that. In turn, he would like to be able to help other people who can't see.”
