SCORING

The minimum passing score for the written portion is 80%. The practical portion is graded on a pass/fail basis. You must pass the practical at 100% to be successful. To receive a Washington State Patrol Fire Protection Bureau Certificate of Competency, you should pass both the written and practical exam within a one-year time frame. Both portions of the exam should be completed within the time frame of the same version of the NFPA standard, and you should have met all required prerequisites.

PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING CERTIFICATION INFORMATION AND APPEAL RIGHTS

The Test Control Officer has the authority to arbitrate any disputes candidates may have with an evaluator's grading decision and/or the evaluation process. The Test Control Officer is the final authority on the test site. The candidate has the right to appeal any decision made by the Test Control Officer by filing an appeal in writing to the State Certification Administrator.

- Appeals on the written and/or practical examination scores must be filed with the Fire Protection Bureau, Accreditation and Certification office, within 30 days after test results notification. I understand that I have the right to further appeal any decision made by the State Certification Administrator by filing a written request for a formal hearing in accordance with RCW 34.05.410-494 within 30 days of receiving results of my initial appeal from the Accreditation and Certification office.
• Candidates who have NOT had access to the current state testing information and skills sheets for the level applied for are responsible to notify the Test Control Officer and written test proctor prior to participation in the practical exam. Skills sheets are available online at www.wsp.wa.gov and are located in the State Fire Marshal's Office, Fire Protection Bureau, Accreditation and Certification section of the Web site. To meet IFSAC accreditation criteria, all components of the NFPA standard are subject to testing, regardless of the curriculum or textbooks used for training.
• Candidates may be participating in live fire testing at the test site. By signing this application, the candidate acknowledges that he/she has appropriate PPE and has been fit tested for SCBA prior to participating in the practical exam. Failure to disclose issues with PPE or SCBA will void certification test results and/or cause certification to be removed.
• By signing this application, the candidate acknowledges that he/she has met all prerequisites required to enter the certification test level and has been trained to the current edition of the NFPA standard version that will be tested. Certification will be withheld and/or voided if all necessary prerequisites have not been met at the time of testing. Certification is dependent on all related documents being submitted for final certification approval at the Accreditation and Certification office.

I understand my test scores may be released to my department and/or course instructor, if requested. Requests for release of test results to potential employers must be made in writing to the Standards and Accreditation Office by the candidate. By signing this application, the candidate acknowledges that he/she is at least 18 years of age at the time of testing.
