Were safety issues appropriately handled?		
Were the scenarios properly completed by candidates—completion of entire job performance requirement? (i.e., the candidate should complete each scenario as required by the task sheets)		
Was set-up and rehearsal conducted with the evaluators prior to the candidate arriving at the test station?
