## **Reduced Visibility on I-90**

The Washington State Patrol is advising motorists traveling in Eastern Washington there is an ongoing possibility of intermittent blowing dust and reduced visibility on I-90. The affected area is currently from mile post 191 to 197 which is approximately twenty miles east of Moses Lake, but it may extend further if the conditions worsen. These conditions are not exclusive to I-90 and may extend onto the county roads in the area.

The WSP would like to remind motorists to drive with caution and prepare your vehicle and occupants for the conditions that may exist including an extended delay. If travel is required, please slow down, turn on your headlights and consider the use of your emergency hazard lights as conditions dictate. If the conditions are too extreme for you to continue, please exit the freeway as soon as is practical; if you cannot exit the freeway, pull as far to the right as possible and remain in your vehicle.
