

WSP Seeks information About Stolen Historical Marker

Olympia – The Washington State Patrol (WSP) is seeking anyone with information about the theft of a historical marker from the Capitol Campus. The marker was placed on the west campus by the Daughters of the American Revolution in 1924 to mark the location of Washington’s First Governor Isaac Stevens’ house.
