State Fire Mobilization Authorized for the Coulee Meadows Fire

Douglas County – State fire assistance has been mobilized under the Washington State Fire Services Resource Mobilization Plan in support of local firefighters working to contain the Coulee Meadows Fire located in Douglas County, near Ephrata. The Coulee Meadows Fire is burning in sage and grass. Washington State Patrol Chief John Batiste authorized the mobilization of state firefighting resources on July 30, 2020, at 11:45 pm at the request of Fire Chief Dale Jordan, Douglas County Fire District 1.

The Coulee Meadows Fire started on July 30, 2020, at approximately 7:53 pm. This fire is estimated at 250 acres and growing. It is threatening homes, crops, and the Palisades. Level 1 evacuations are in effect at this time. The fire cause is currently under investigation.

Mobilization specialists from the Fire Protection Bureau have ordered three strike teams, hand crews, and heavy equipment. The fire will be managed by a Type 3 Incident Management Team.

The State Emergency Operations Center at Camp Murray remains elevated to Level 1. State Fire Marshal's Office personnel are en route to the scene to coordinate dispatch of resources.

Under the State Fire Services Resource Mobilization Plan, the Fire Protection Bureau coordinates the initial dispatch and continued administrative oversight of resources and personnel for the duration of the mobilization. The Mobilization Plan is implemented to provide a process to quickly notify, assemble and deploy fire service personnel, equipment and other resources from around the state when fires, disasters or other events exceed the capacity of local jurisdictions. The State Fire Marshal's Office is a Bureau of the Washington State Patrol, providing fire and life safety services to the citizens of Washington State including inspections of state licensed facilities, plan review of school construction projects, licensing of fire sprinkler contractors and pyrotechnic operators, training Washington States firefighters, and collecting emergency response data.
