#### Fire Training Academy: Chainsaws

NORTH BEND, Wash. - Recruits at the Washington State Patrol (WSP) Fire Training Academy (FTA) in North Bend practiced utilizing their chainsaws and other firefighting equipment to cut into and open an simulation roof prop this week.

The training enhances their understanding and knowledge of how to vertically ventilate a fire that is in a structure that has a pitched roof, most likely a resident-type structure. The knowledge and experience allows them to have a deeper understanding of how to remove toxic smoke and heat from a structure, and how to drastically improve working conditions for crews fighting the fires inside the structure, which lessen the likelihood the fire will spread to other areas of the structure.

#### Arizona man from 2021 MECTF case sentenced to 30 years in federal prison

SPOKANE, Wash. - A 25-year-old Arizona man arrested by the WSP Eastern Washington Missing and Exploited Children's Task Force (MECTF) detectives and Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) agents in January 2021 was sentenced to 30-years in federal prison on Feb. 16, 2022, for the sexual exploitation of a 12-year-old Spokane girl.

The man was taken into custody after soliciting extremely graphic and sexually explicit messages with the 12-year-old. After learning her true name and age, the 25-year-old man convinced the girl to share where she lived and developed a detailed plan to kidnap, rape, and traffic the minor. When detectives learned the man purchased an airline ticket to travel from Phoenix to Spokane to carry out the crimes, a nationwide extraditable arrest warrant was obtained.

WSP detectives worked in partnership with the Phoenix Police Department (PPD) to execute the arrest warrant and obtained a search warrant of the man's residence, which yielded images, videos, and communications with the 12-year-old girl, as well as a collection of copious amounts of other child sexual abuse material.

The man will serve his 30-year sentence in federal prison after being found guilty of Child Sex Trafficking, Online Enticement, and Child Pornography, Production and Receipt.
