

National Missing and Murdered Indigenous

Statewide 'Arrive Alive' emphasis today



STATEWIDE - The Washington State Patrol (WSP) is partnering with allied law enforcement agencies across the state to conduct a High Visibility Emphasis (HVE) patrol aimed at reducing serious injury and fatality collision, as well as deterring and interdicting crime. The 24-hour emphasis utilizes agency collected data to help our troopers determine which areas will make the largest impact in saving lives, with saturation patrols during peak collision times. Of the more than 10,200 collisions investigated in the first four months of 2023, 177 involved serious injuries while 64 ended in fatalities. In 2022, troopers investigated 10,579 collisions - 95 of which were fatalities in the same time frame.

The Washington State Patrol (WSP) is proud of the dedicated work by our agency's tribal liaisons do each day to continue building relationships with the numerous Native communities across the state, including working closely with our agency's Missing and Unidentified persons Unit (MPUP) in the development of the Missing Indigenous Person Alert (MIPA). AWARENESS - The Washington State Patrol (WSP) Bomb Squad held their annual inservice training at the Washington State Fire Training Academy (FTA) in North Bend last week. Check out next week's edition of *The Milepost* to learn about the program. **OLYMPIA, Wash.** - The Washington State Patrol (WSP) Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Bureau's New Entrant detachment completed an astounding 1,533 safety audit investigations throughout 2022. This was only achievable with the addition of a Transportation Specialist position in August of 2022, which alleviated the daunting task of contacting each new motor carrier in Washington. Previously, one of the investigators took on the primary role of calling, e-mailing, and sending letters to establish a motor carrier's operation. This is required for every new motor carrier in the state with a USDOT number. Often, other officers in the detachment would hep out with making contacts as well. Adding the Transportation Specialist freed up one officer to get back to investigations, and allow for streamlining the process with a single point of contact for all motor carriers.

Aviation's Tactical Flight Officer program

OLYMPIA, Wash. - The Washington State Patrol (WSP) Aviation Section is able to support the agency with the use of some very specialized equipment. The Cessna 206, FLIR camera, and all associated software and hardware make it possible to work anywhere, anytime of day. We can proactively locate speeding, aggressive, and reckless drivers, DUIs, LoJack hits, hazards on the freeway, as well as assist with eluding vehicles, suspect searches, and provide details for scenes and incidents from a different point of view.

The skilled abilities and combined efforts of the aircraft, consisting of a pilot (top right) and Tactical Flight Officer (TFO) (bottom right), are necessary for successful mission outcomes. The pilot works to ensure the aircraft is operated safely and legally, while providing the best viewing advantage for the camera, but the job of the TFO is just as important; the TFO is in charge of the camera, and all that equipment.

The TFO is responsible for coordinating resources, as well as providing probable cause and safety information to units on the ground. The TFO acts as the eyes and voice of the aircraft and requires skills to manage multiple tasks at once. During incidents, such as assisting with a pursuit, the TFO is required to operate the camera utilizing an advanced "gaming" style controller with multiple modes and functions, communicate with the ground to provide locations and direction via radio, cell phone, and computer - all while continuously communicating with the pilot.

The Aviation Section could not provide these services on a weekly basis without the help of our reserve TFO's from the field. We currently utilize reserve TFO's from District 2, District 7, and District 8 for our weekly Target Zero Aerial Patrols (TZAP) missions. The Aviation Section provides TFO's training on operating the equipment and systems, and they rotate throughout the year, typically one week at a time. They would not be able to do what they do without the help and support of the Field Operations Bureau.

Mock DUI event shows realities of impaired driving


