CHEHALIS, Wash, - Chehalis WSP troopers and civilian staff assisted at this year's Safety City in Chehalis where 710 kindergarten through second-grade students learned about a variety of safety topics.

Safety City was set up at Richie Bros. in Chehalis offering four stations where local public safety personnel would provide presentations on pedestrian/bicycle/personal safety, railroad track safety, when to call 9-1-1 and bus safety.

The event has been going on for more than two decades and has grown each year, thanks to the ongoing support of the Washington Traffic Safety Commission, the Lewis County Sheriff's Office, Chehalis Centralia Pupil Transportation Co-op, Lewis County 911 and Operation Life Saver, and the WSP. This year also included volunteers from the Napavine Police Department, Chehalis Police Department, Centralia Police Department, Riverside Fire, and Fire District 6. The Lewis County Victim's Panel assisted with funding the program, which includes individual goodie bags provided to each participating student. An additional grant covered transportation costs to and from the event. A special shout out to Chehalis Detachment Secretary Senior Michelle Pardue, who has been organizing the event since 2018.

WSP SWAT, Bomb Squad respond to assist Centralia PD

CENTRALIA, Wash. - Our WSP Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) team and our Bomb Squad was called to assist the Centralia Police Department with a

barricaded subject Thursday morning The man, accused of domestic violence and assault, was armed and barricaded in his Centralia-area home.

WSP SWAT responded to assist. Members of the WSP SWAT Crisis Negotiation Team (CNT) assisted the CPD negotiators in hopes of having the man comply with law enforcement commands. Negotiations were successful, leading to the man being taken into custody without incident.

Our WSP SWAT team is often called to

assist our smaller allied agency partners who are not equipped with the appropriate resources or equipment to handle dynamic situations of this magnitude. In any situation, our team is equipped with a variety of tactics training, and resources, including negotiators and less lethal tools, to utilize while navigating such potentially volatile scenes.
