Trooper Atkinson is back in uniform catching up on training to soon return to full duties and continue to serve his Walla Walla community.





Night of 1,000 Stars events statewide



STATEWIDE - Washington State Patrol (WSP) troopers are working alongside law enforcement agencies across the state during Target Zero's Night of 1,000 Stars event. The night, specific to each county, focuses the efforts of troopers, officers, and deputies within a specific area to intercept impaired drivers before they cause a collision that could cost a life. The events are kicked off with a briefing that often is attended by the family members of an individual who was killed in an impaired driving collision. Thank you to all the troopers who have participated in these events across the state this month. In District 5, participating agencies were able to remove 10 impaired drivers from their roadways - seven of which were processed utilizing the agency's Mobile Impairment Driving Unit. In District 8, Bremerton area patrols conducted 65 traffic stops resulting in the removal of six impaired drivers from the roadways. See more iimages from the events on page two.

D1 teams up with allied agencies for HVE patrol

FIFE, Wash. - Our Washington State Patrol (WSP) troopers in District 1 partnered with the Pierce County Sheriff's Office (PCSO) and Fife Police Department (FPD) for a two-day High Visibility Emphasis (HVE) Patrol on Dec. 14 and Dec. 15. The focus of the patrol was the five-mile radius surrounding Interstate 5 at the Port of Tacoma, which is one of the areas within the district that sees a high volume of collisions.

Other WSP divisions also assisted in the emphasis, including commercial vehicle enforcement officers and our agency's aviation team

During the emphasis a PCSO deputy was attempting to stop a vehicle for suspected DUI. The driver fled and a short pursuit ensued. The impaired driver ended up striking a pole, ending the pursuit. The driver was taken into custody for suspicion of DUI and eluding.



Our focus was the five-mile radius of I-5 at Port of Tacoma. In just two days, we made:

WSP Bomb Squad respond to pipe bomb in Tumwater



Members of the bomb squad responded and were able to confirm the device was an IED and utilized a countercharge to render it unworkable.
