40 years of Safety City



CHEHALIS, Wash. - It's the 40th anniversary of Safety City, an educational program organized by the Lewis County Target Zero Task Force.

Participating students have six stations this year to see – the city itself, calling 9-1-1, school bus safety, train track safety, water safety, and the new electrical safety station with the Lewis County PUD.

Local law enforcement agencies are invited to serve as tour guides through the city itself and, also new this year, we have members of the local fire departments talking to them about water safety. This year's week-long event will host 800 public, private, and homeschool students.

The students are provided goodie bags, which are donated by the involved agencies. There is no specific funding for the event, though in the past it has been made successful thanks to the Lewis County DUI Victim's Impact Panel who assist with purchasing giveaways, event insurance, and other items to keep the program growing, in addition to local assistance and other grant funding.

HISTORY OF THE PROGRAM

The first Safety City was held in 1976 and officially became an annual event in 1984. Even through pandemic lockdowns, the program pressed on - just in digital form.

Founded by Operation Lifesaver and the Centralia/Chehalis Transportation Co-op, the Safety City Program was given to the Lewis County Task Force (now known as the Target Zero Task Force) in 2004, where it has stayed to this day. The Washington State Patrol (WSP) Chehalis Detachment has become the primary facilitator of the program in recent years. The planning for the multi-day event is a group effort with the

BREMERTON, Wash. - Trooper Katherine Weatherwax has been having a wonderful time going into classrooms and teaching kids about science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM).

WSP personnel use technology, engineering, and math in our daily work lives, particularly at collision scenes. On multiple occasions, Trooper Weatherwax has talked to students about what state troopers do and about her specialty position within our agency as a collision technical specialist (CTS).

She teaches the kids how to measure tire friction marks and use math formulas to find speed. She also teaches them about a drag sled. As an activity, the students measure a "tire friction mark," play with the drag sled, and learn how weight and friction affect stopping distances.

"It's been a great opportunity to teach the students a little about our job, and it also allows them to ask questions and interact with law enforcement," says Trooper Weatherwax. She's been welcomed in schools across the Olympic Peninsula and looks forward to visiting other classrooms!
